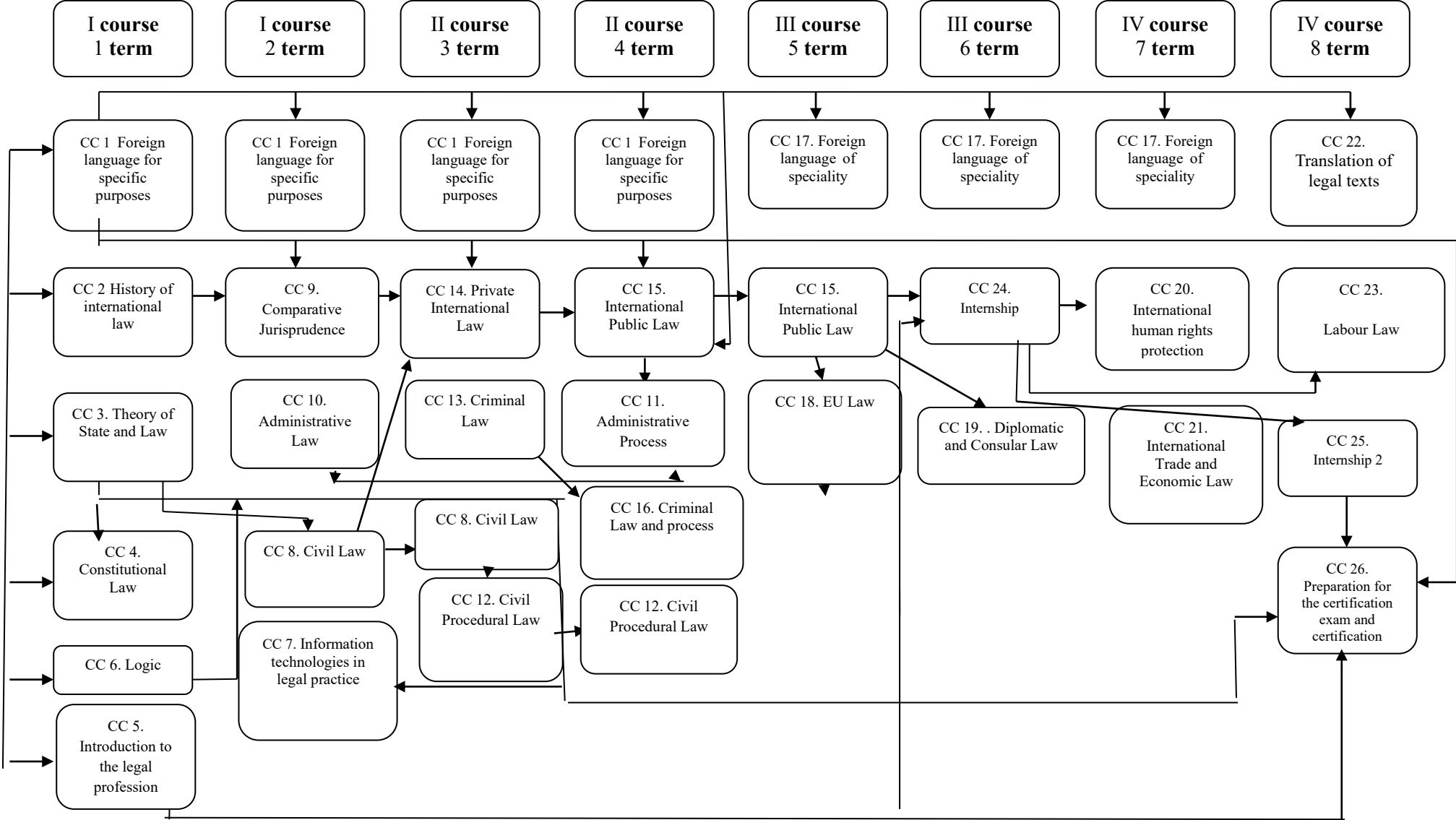

3. FORMS OF CERTIFICATION OF HIGHER EDUCATION STUDENTS

Higher education applicants implement the formation of an individual educational trajectory by selecting elective components. The proposed list of recommended elective components is not exhaustive. Taking into account the provisions of Art. 62 of the Law of Ukraine "On Higher Education", applicants are free to choose any elective components within the amount of academic load allocated to the elective part of the educational programme from other educational programmes, both similar and other levels of higher education, in agreement with the dean of the faculty. The procedure for the formation of an individual educational trajectory is regulated by the Regulations on the organisation of the educational process of students
